Supervisor's Meeting

October 6, 2020

The regular meeting of the Board of Supervisors, held at the Township Municipal Building, was called to order by Vice-Chairman Tom Applequist at 6:30 P.M. PLEDGE The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

At the Board of Supervisors Meeting held on September 1,2020 the Board adjourned the meeting to go into Executive Session to discuss several personnel matters. No Action was taken.

MINUTES

Motion by Applequist, seconded by Retsch, to approve the minutes of the September 1, 2020 regular meeting as written. Vote of 4 to 0 in favor.

BILLS

Motion by Retsch, seconded by Phipps, to pay the bills from the General Account, September 2nd through September 30th for \$243,135.00 and as of October 6^{th} for \$305,071.10 with the signing of the checks following the meeting. Vote of 4 to 0 in favor.

TREASURERS REPORT

Treasurer Elois Nadzak read her Treasurers Report for the month of September with a beginning balance of \$1,183,314.92 and an ending balance of \$1,201,311.54.

RES #07-20

Motion by Martin, seconded by Retsch, to adopt Resolution No. 07-20 for the Sewage Facility for Sandra Wood property on Landwood Lane. Vote of 4 to 0 in favor.

HEARING SALDO/ZON

Motion by Phipps, seconded by Retsch, to set November 3, 2020 6:00 pm as the hearing date for public comment to the proposed amendments to AMMENDMENTS the Subdivision and Land Development Ordinance and the Township Zoning Ordinance. Vote of 4 to 0 in favor.

MMO

Motion by Retsch, seconded by Phipps, to accept the 2021 MMO (Minimal Municipal Obligation). Vote of 4 to 0 in favor.

ADVERTISE MANAGER

Supervisor Phipps put together a packet of information responsibilities for the Township Manager/Zoning Officer's position. He also prepared a job description and requirements.

Resident Albert Horn, 132 Paige Drive, questioned if the Supervisors were looking to replace the current Manager/Zoning Officer with a person in the same position or if they will be separate positions. The Board told him the job will continue the same as it currently is, Manager and Zoning Officer.

Motion by Retsch, seconded by Martin, to advertise for the Township's Manager Position. Vote of 4 to 0 in favor.

TIRE COLLECTION

Supervisor Applequist reminded the public of Tire Collection at the Municipal Building on October 17th 9am to 12 pm. He also advised that there is a need of volunteers.

STREET LIGHTS

The Board discussed adding two street lights in the Township. The Township currently has eight and if two more were added, the utility company would convert them to LED to decrease the electric usage. Chief Leindecker will submit a list of areas in the Township that need a light.

Albert Horn stated that pulling out of Paige Drive can be dangerous at times. He felt that adding a streetlight above the intersection of Paige Dr. and Big Knob Rd. would benefit the residents.

IMPLEMENT MS4 FEE

The Board discussed implementing a stormwater fee. The discussion included the costs of properties over ten acres, the amount of the fee to be charged to the residents, who will collect the fee, penalties and the \$750.00 to write the program.

Supervisor Mike Phipps voiced his concern that these decisions needed to be made as soon as possible in order to have the program written and ready for the beginning of 2021.

It was agreed the matter will be discussed and ready for action at the November meeting.

Motion by Martin, seconded by Phipps, to adopt Ordinance No. 219 amending the Pennsylvania Municipal Retirement System (PMRS) for the office staff Pension Plan. Vote of 4 to 0 in favor.

HIRE

Motion by Martin, seconded by Phipps, to create a list to hire Part Time Police Officers. Vote of 4 to 0 in favor.

POTTS CONLEY

RESIGNATION Motion by Retsch, seconded by Phipps, to accept the resignations of Part Time Police Officers Jeremy Conley and Zachary Potts. Vote of 4 to 0 in favor.

REFUND PENNENERGY

The Police Department received \$3,279.97 refund from PennEnergy Resources for police services.

MONTHLY RPT Supervisor Doug Martin read the police department's monthly report for September 2020, which included the number of police calls, vehicle maintenance, arrests and citations issued.
